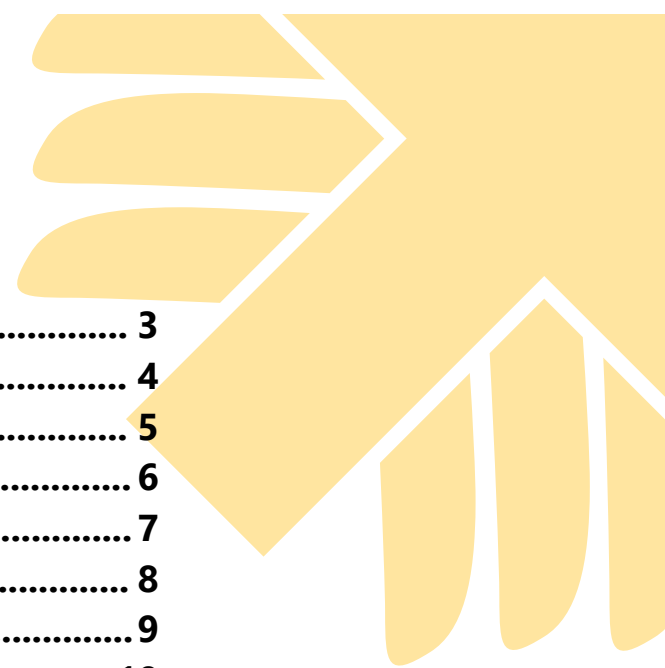

WORD OF THE BISHOP

Bishop Vasyl Ivasyuk, ruling bishop
of the Kolomyia Eparchy of the Ukrainian Greek Catholic Church.

“Let us not grow weary in doing good, for at the proper time we will reap a harvest if we do not give up” (Galatians 6:9).

For the main diocesan charitable foundation “Caritas Kolomyia” of the Kolomyia Diocese of the Ukrainian Greek Catholic Church, 2025 was a year of intensified service to those bearing the heaviest burdens of the war, as well as a time of internal strengthening for the community dedicated to helping others.

Supporting the families of veterans, fallen soldiers, prisoners of war, and missing-in-action servicemen became a priority. Through the development of new support programs, particularly the launch of the “Healing” project, Caritas Kolomyia created spaces for psychological, legal, and spiritual support where families found solace, understanding, and a sense of community.

Caring for the moral and spiritual well-being of Caritas staff and volunteers remained a key focus. Throughout the year, retreats and spiritual renewal events were held to support those who serve people in difficult life circumstances on a daily basis.

At the same time, 2025 was marked by the strengthening of the institutional capacity of the Caritas network of the Kolomyia Diocese. The official registration of Caritas Horodenka and Caritas Sniatyn as charitable foundations opened new opportunities for development, partnership, and the expansion of social ministry in communities.

CARITAS-NADVIRNA

A space offering support, care, and social services for people facing difficult life circumstances.

The organization combines humanitarian, psychological, medical, and social assistance to support internally displaced persons, veterans, the elderly, people with disabilities, and families in crisis.

IMPORTANT RESULTS FOR 2025:

- 1,731 people received support at Resilience Centers.
- 771 psychological counseling sessions and 811 group sessions were conducted.
- 174 patients received palliative care at home.
- 9,650 hot meals were served at the charity cafeteria.
- 20 people stayed at the shelter in accordance with Resolution No. 930.
- The medical center conducted 4,679 medical consultations.
- The following charity campaigns were carried out: "School Backpack," "Christmas Candle," "Feed the Poor," "Easter Basket," "Help St. Nicholas."

IMPACT ON THE COMMUNITY

By 2025, CARITAS-NADVIRNA had become one of the key support centers in the Nadvirna region.

The organization provided social, psychological, medical, and humanitarian assistance to vulnerable populations, fostering community cohesion, promoting mutual aid, and support.

PRIORITIES FOR 2026:

Developing Resilience and Psychological Support Centers, expanding palliative care and social services, strengthening the operations of the charitable soup kitchen, establishing a social café and bakery, supporting internally displaced persons, and ensuring energy independence for social centers.

- Implementation of targeted programs for emotional recovery and support for the families of military personnel and veterans.
- Setting up children's spaces and holding regular creative activities and workshops.
- Conducting environmental clean-up and beautification campaigns in mountainous areas.
- Humanitarian aid and support for IDPs in mountainous areas
- Support for veterans and families of military personnel
- Support for families in crisis
- Development of volunteerism

IMPACT ON THE COMMUNITY

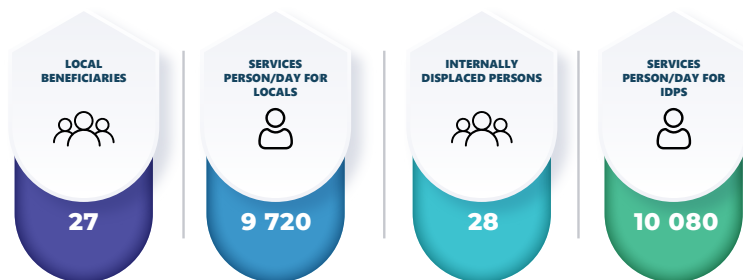

MS. ANNA, 86 YEARS OLD

THE “HOME CARE” PROJECT

Ms. Anna lives alone. Due to her deteriorating eyesight and health, it is becoming increasingly difficult for her to manage her daily tasks on her own. She lost her husband at a young age, and over the years, her loneliness and health problems have only worsened.

As part of the “Home Care” project, Ms. Anna receives regular support from a social worker:

- help with household chores
- grocery shopping
- emotional support through conversation

“She’s like family to me. Without her, I wouldn’t know what to do,” Ms. Anna shares.

Oksana is running her own bakery in Kolomyia. Despite the challenges of wartime, she has continued to work and grow her local business.

Thanks to support from the REMARKET grant program, she has been able to improve working conditions and expand production capacity.

Today, the bakery is not only a place where bread and pastries are baked every day, but also an example of how supporting small businesses helps people remain resilient and develop their community even in difficult times.

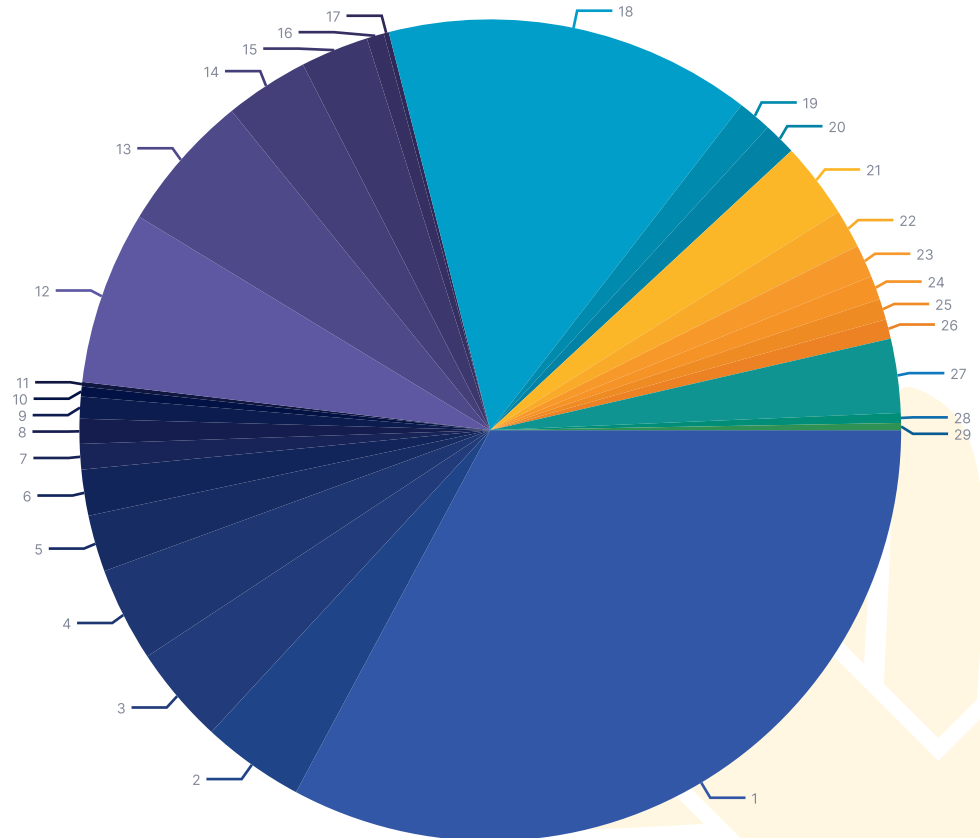

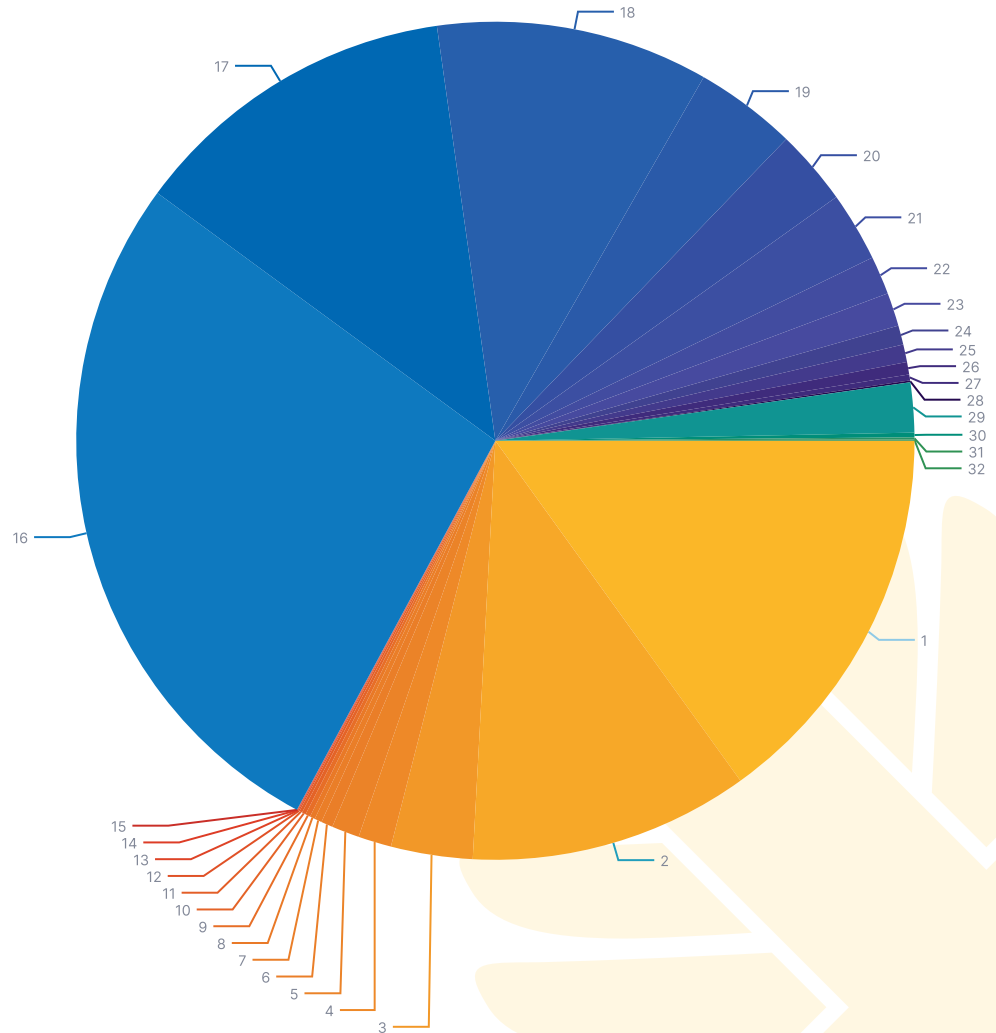
